- o Ken Hash addressed the email he received from Dave Fine –

*Weyerhaeuser Rail to Trail – attorneys are talking, infrastructure is still in place for future trail

*Repainting of bike lanes – Traffic Division is currently short one crew member with no summer help, so only the highest priorities were completed this summer. Next summer hopefully will be better staffed.

*Members terms – Clark Carroll and Elizabeth Stratton plan to stay on for another term. Colleen Holton will end her term in 2020.

- o Clark Carroll inquired about rail in Lexington and if it will be rebuilt?
- o Elizabeth Stratton is hoping to restart the Safe Routes to School and that this group can collaborate with them. Ken Hash shared about the revisions at North Lake Elementary. Buses and parents have switched pick up locations for the students. Ruth Kendall suggested that everyone read the TDN article on the Lexington School on traffic management.
- o Ruth Kendall stated that she was recently on the Highlands Trail and the gates are not bike friendly and people just ride around them. It is the same with barricades on the Dike Trail at 42nd Ave. Ken Hash stated that the City is waiting on funding for crosswalks and 38th Ave and 42nd Ave.
