- **APPROVAL OF MEETING NOTES**

- **OLD BUSINESS**

- o SR-4 CORRIDOR PLANNING EFFORT

Ken Hash shared that a meeting is set for January 20th at 1 pm with Jason Gibbens for wrap up and next steps. Ken will send out invites if anyone wants to listen in.

- o BIKE (NON MOTORIZED) PLAN UPDATE

Ken Hash is working with Dave Fine, who is taking the lead on this effort. A meeting is scheduled for January 16th at 4:30 to divide up tasks. Anyone else that wants to be involved, please let him know.

- o HIGHLANDS TRAIL CROSSING UPDATE

We may have to wait until the non-motorized plan is in place to make any changes. Ken has driven the area a couple of times. At Douglas and Alder, a 3 way stop may be possible. The 26th Ave crossing has a blind spot for drivers to those on the trail. Overall, need a bike plan before making in the field changes.

- o DIKE TRAIL UPDATE

Two locations on the Dike Trail at 38th and 42nd. Grant was aimed towards pedestrians and not bike riders. Ken Hash will follow up on the slope near the gate at 42nd with CDID #1.

- **NEW BUSINESS**

- o KELSO – WEST MAIN PROJECT

Cory Kratovil, PBS Engineering, discussed the City of Kelso's new Caitlin Street Phase II project design, including Phase I. Options were discussed for the City of Longview to come up with a bike lane transition from Kelso bike lane to Ocean Beach Highway with no bike lane.

- **BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS**

- o Clark Carroll inquired about signage heading East on SR 4 turning left onto Cowlitz Way, there are no signs indicating it is Cowlitz Way.
- o Elizabeth is working on facilitating a program targeting the Highlands Neighborhood called Walk with Ease, developed by the Arthritis Foundation. It is a 6 week walking program that focuses on improving arthritis symptoms, increasing strength and increasing walking pace of people with arthritis and other chronic conditions. She will start in the Highlands and hopes to expand into the larger community. She will keep the group updated as it moves along.
