2. **ROLL CALL**

Special meeting was called to order at approximately 4:01pm by Committee Chair, Bill Josh. Attendance was taken via Zoom, annotated all that were present.

6. STAFF COMMENTS & REPORTS

Kris Swanson, Administrative Services Director

Transition Plan - Section 1 - City Programming, Services and Activities

Kris provided an update on ADA door opener and quere system for services projects. Additional discussion took place on website accessibility, open data access, delivery of digital services, hybrid 'Zoom' meetings. KLTv interface and assisted listening devices. Bill Josh added that the 'Ask Longview' smartphone application is a great way to report and track service request to the City of Longview. This application has brought improved accessibility to city services as well.

Keith Walling

Transition Plan - Section 2 - City Buildings & Facilities

Keith provided a verbal update of current projects in the pipeline that are nearing completion. Not only have the doors to Administrative Service been completed, the doors into Community and Economic Development/Public Works Engineering have also been completed. Striping and signage improvement project are slated to be completed this summer as the weather improves and the PW striping truck is activated for annual summer work. Facilities subcommittee has not had a chance to meet due to COVID 19 restrictions.

Transition Plan - Section 3 - Sidewalks, Curb Ramps, Pedestrian Crossings, Signals & Pushbuttons

Karl Enyeart provided a list of the highest ADA priority and potential projects for the 2021-2025 period. Updates were provided on current projects in the works or nearing completion. Potential stand alone projects for committee recommendation consideration to city council include curb ramp improvements at the following intersections: 18th & Olympia, Vandercook & Maple, 18th & Louisiana, 15th & Hemlock, 14th & Hudson.

Transition Plan - Section 4 - City Parks, Recreational Infrastructure and Programming

An updated ADA transition plan project list was provided by Jennifer Wills and will be made available to the committee in the June 2021 agenda packet. Update was provided on the community garden barrier elimination project.

Tabitha Hayden provided an update to the committee.

Transition Plan - Section 5 - Transit Services

There will be a new route being offered soon, Route #46 increasing service area. Tabitha updated a handful of barrier elimination projects that were in the works or slated to be completed in the near future. Projects were on route service lines and projects are prioritized with high and heavy use and utilization taken into consideration. Tabitha stated that RCT is conducting a bus stop audit to help identify develop a further course of action to develop a future project list.

Allan Rudberg brought up his concern with the curb ramp located at Washington Way & 10th, in particular the ramp located at the fast service restaurant (west bound direction). The ramp appears to be breaking apart and needs some attention. Karl stated that he would look into this concern a bit further.

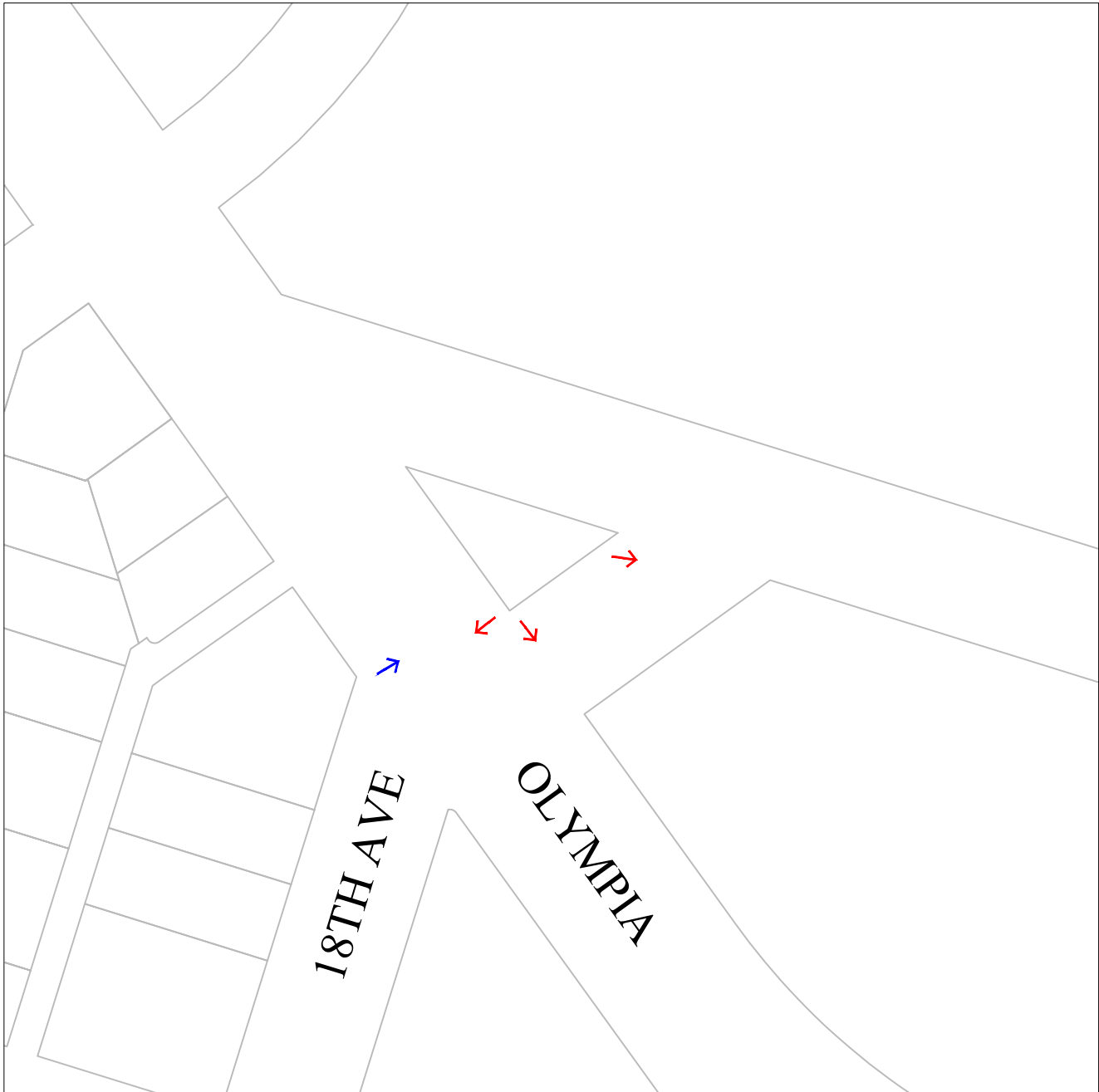
