On a motion duly made and passed the notes from September 27, 2022 were approved as presented.

- **OLD BUSINESS**

- RECRUITMENT OF NEW MEMBERS

Nancy shared that the Council has had some hot topics on their agendas, so we may not see any vacancies filled until the 2023 assignments.

- CALIFORNIA WAY PHOTOS

Morgan shared photos of the curb design on California Way showing the bike lanes transferring to the sidewalk for crossing to avoid large truck traffic.

Clark inquired about the cost of this design. Morgan will follow up.

- WASHINGTON WAY

30% plans are expected this week from the consultants.

- 30TH AVE & BEECH STREET

Morgan has started the initial design phase. Both are also about the 30% design phase.

- PROJECT CONCEPT REVIEW – HUDSON STREET

Morgan Palmer shared the Hudson Street Project options. Option A was the preferred option in the Downtown corridor and possibly using Option B outside the downtown corridor.

From 3rd to 7th the turn lane into medical clinic is heavily used. A sharrow in this stretch might work best until funding is available to widen this stretch.

Clark mentioned that he saw kids unable to cross at 30th & Louisiana. This might be a good intersection for flashing lights.

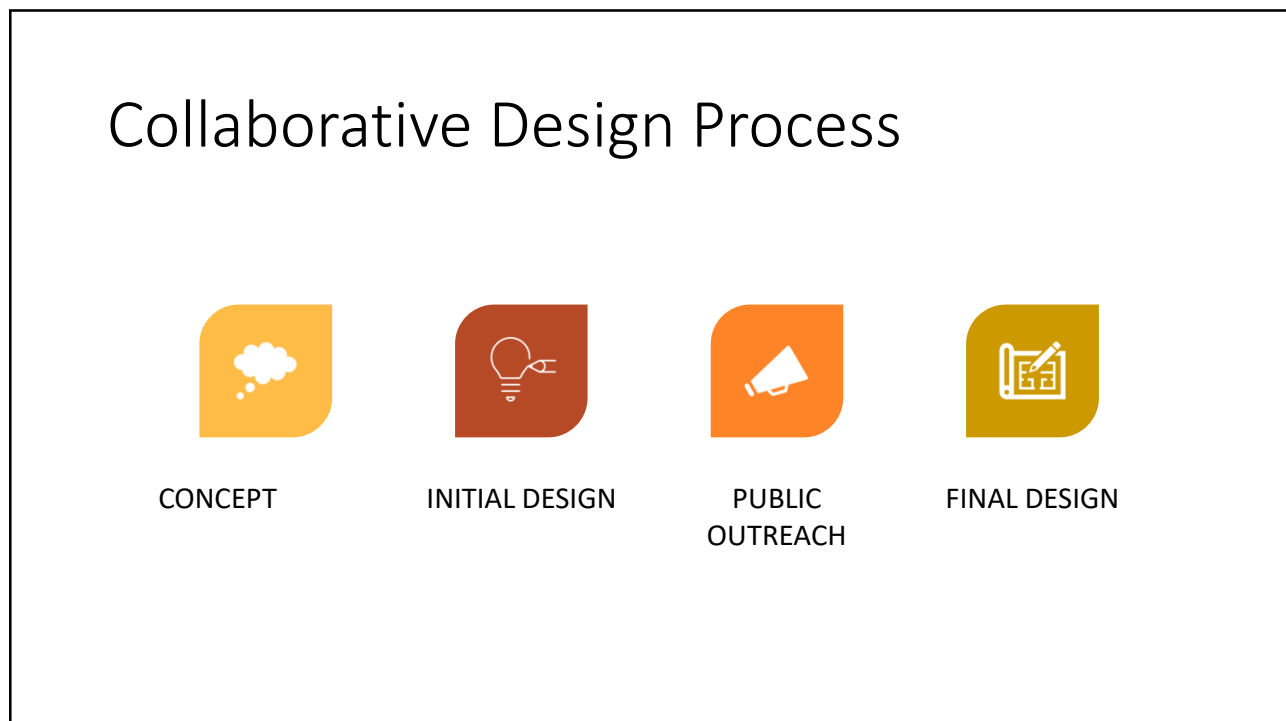

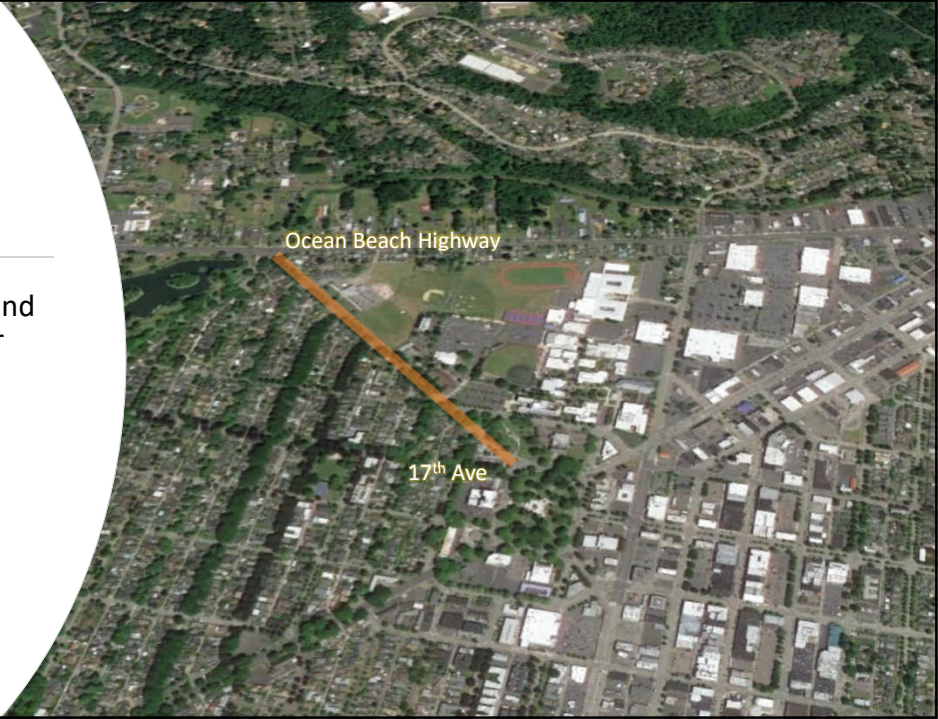

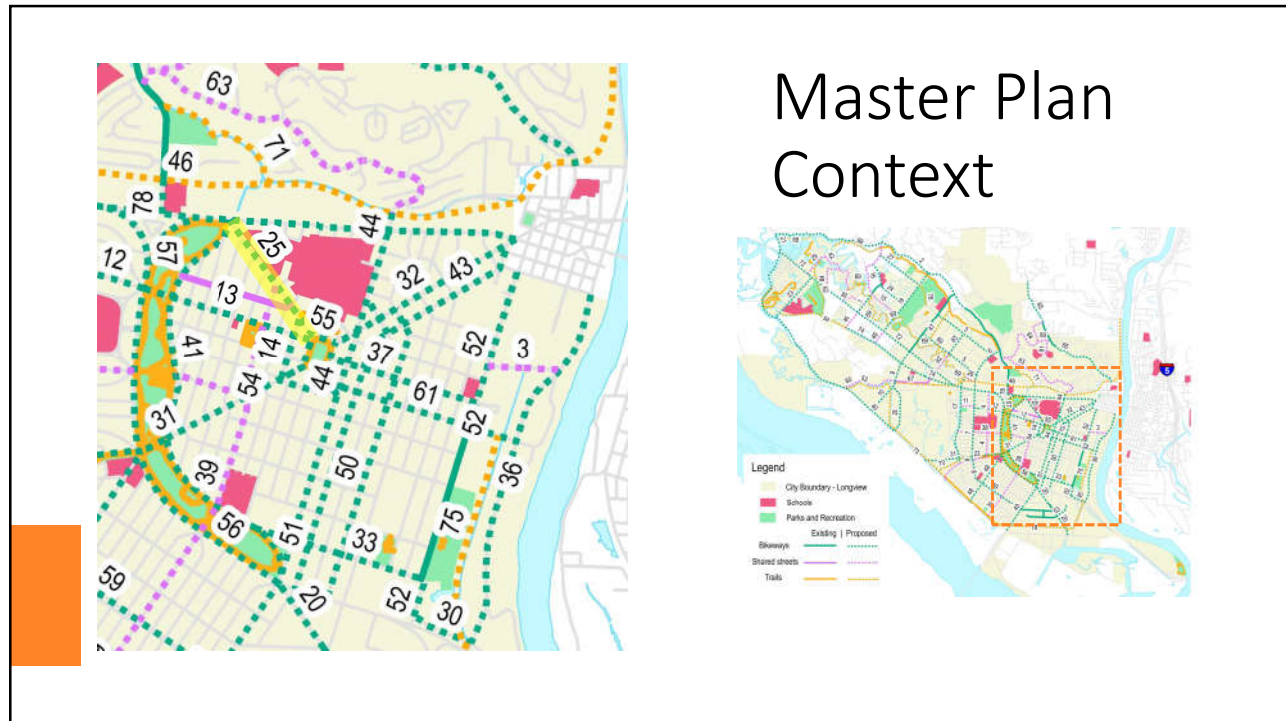

- Low cost, striping improvements



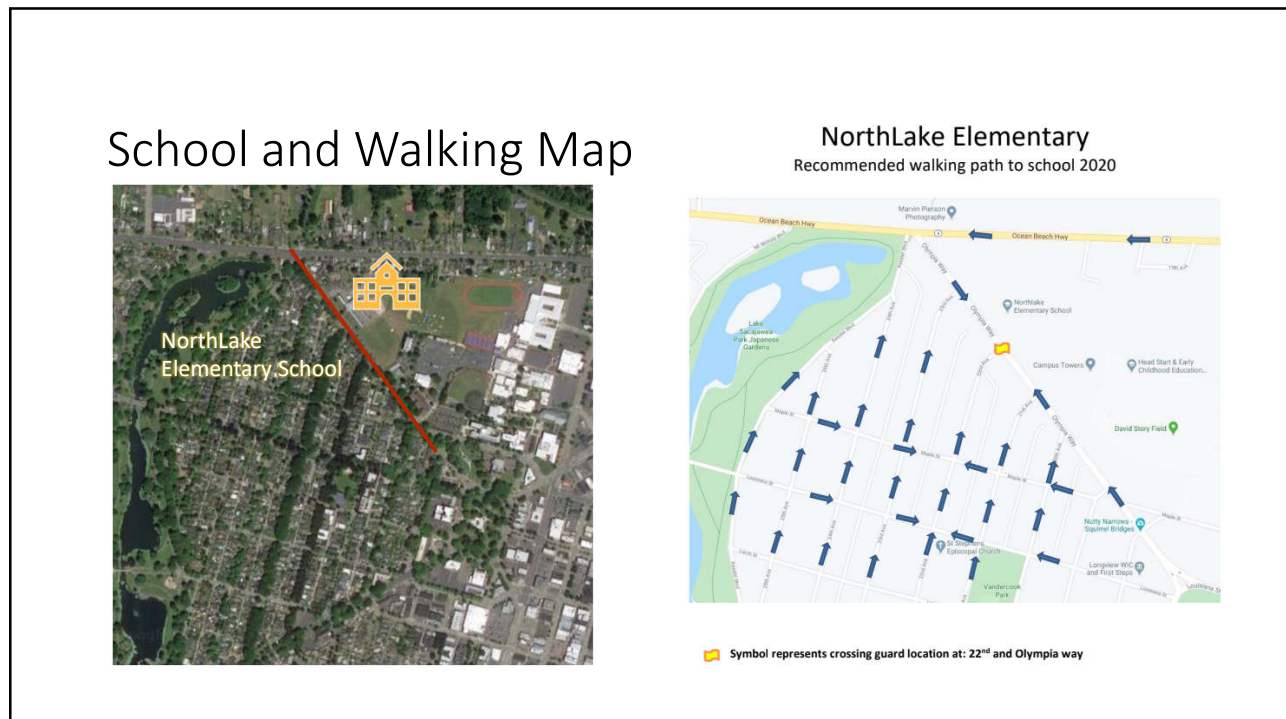

17th Ave

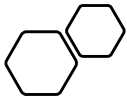
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Existing Conditions

** Curb bulb outs at 19th and 20th*



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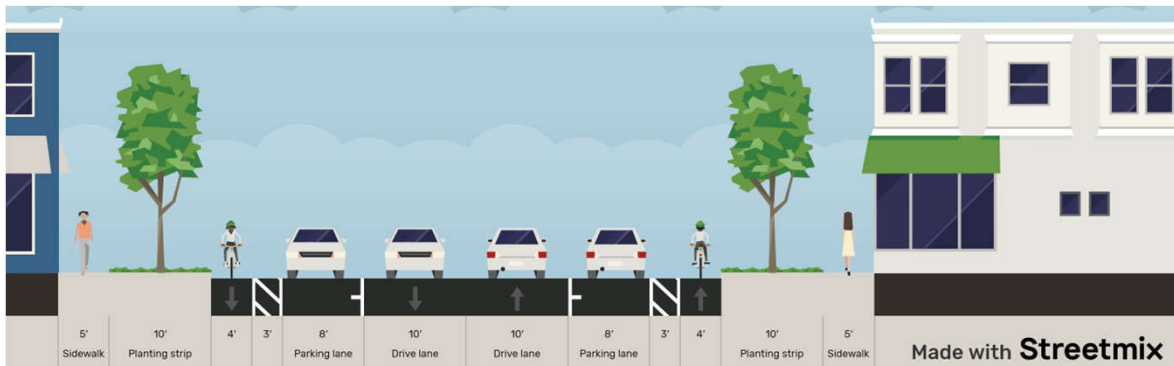
50' street width Option A: Parking-protected on both sides

Pros:

- Lower stress, protected
- School drop-off → less bike/car crossings
- No door zone conflict

Cons:

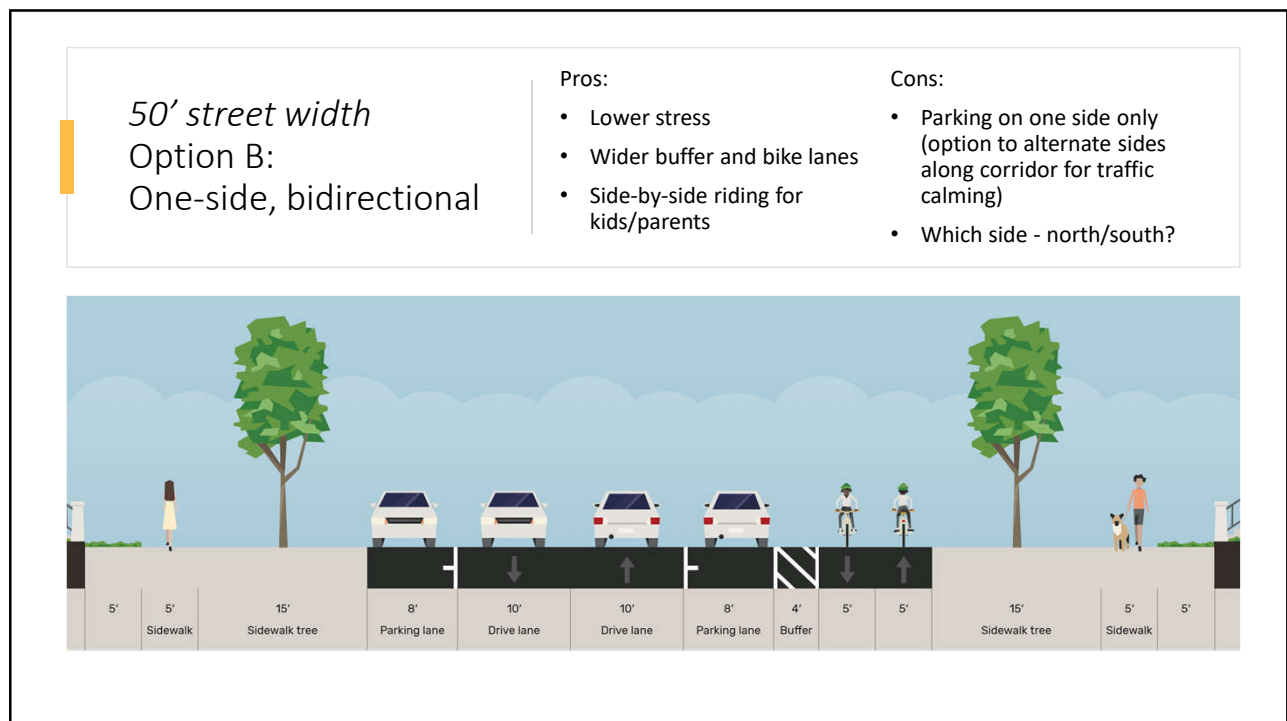
- Width limits side-by-side riding
- Bulbouts: lose 1 or 2 parking spaces at two intersections



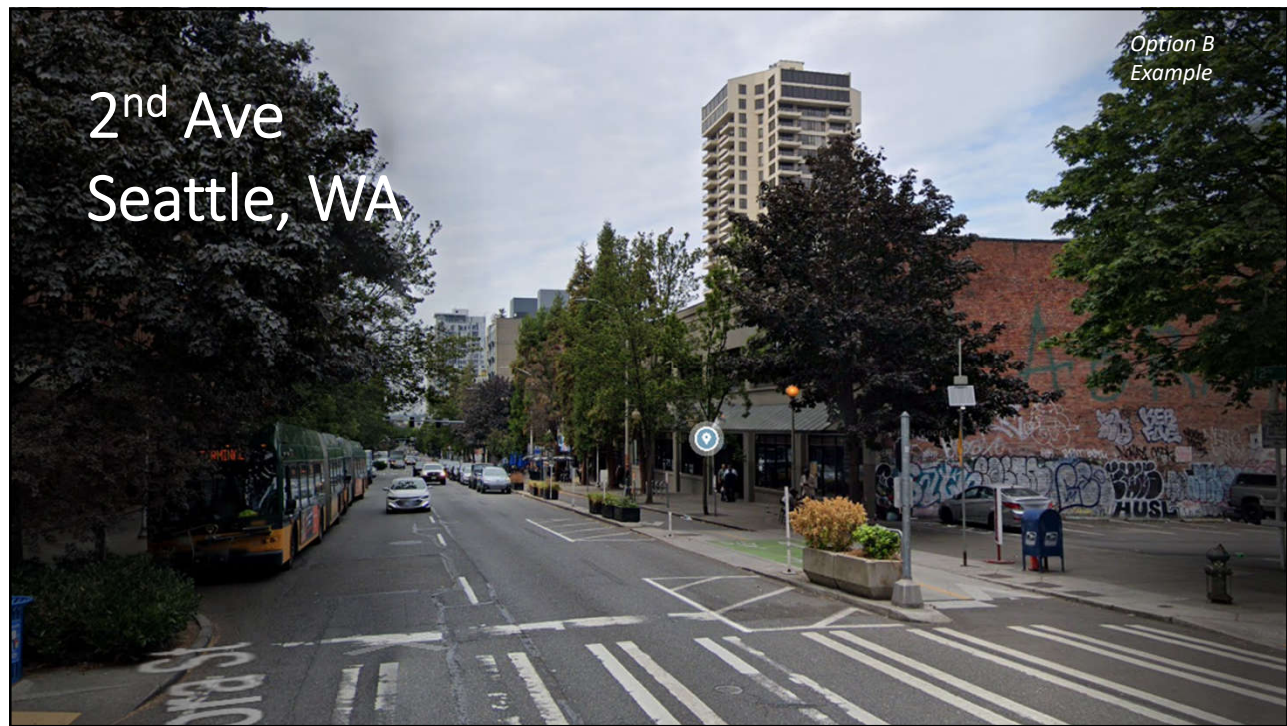
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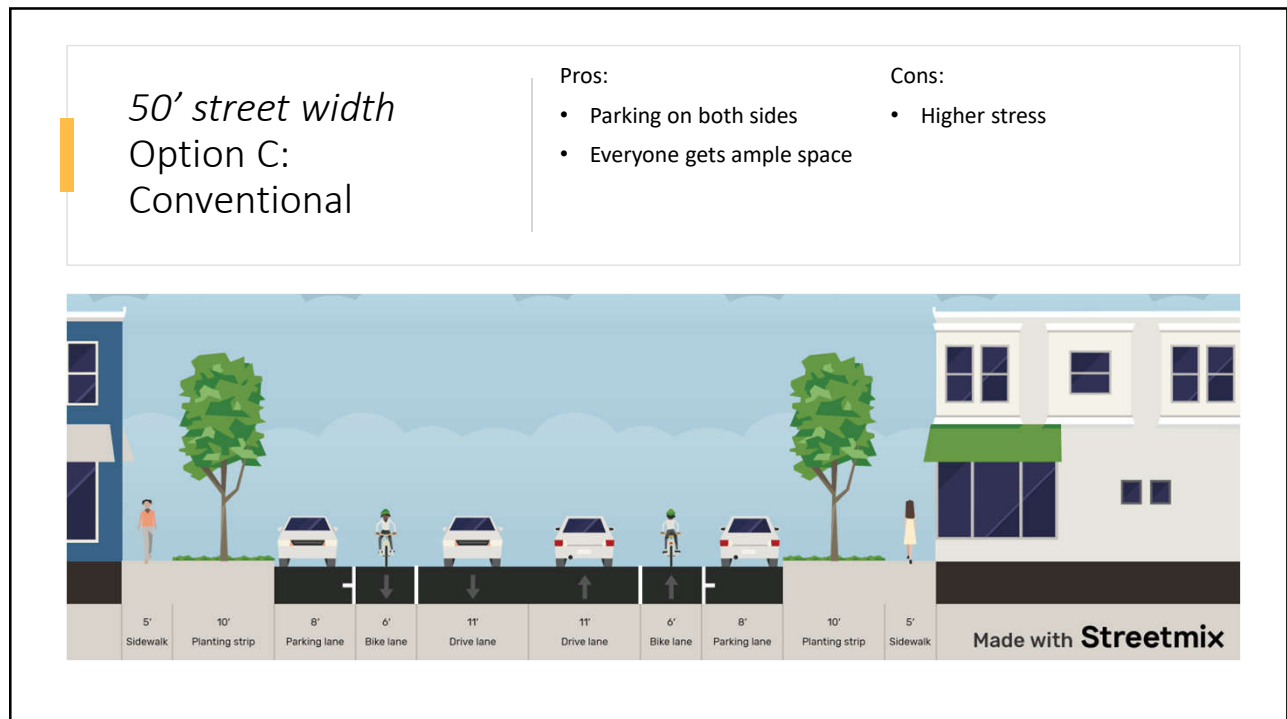
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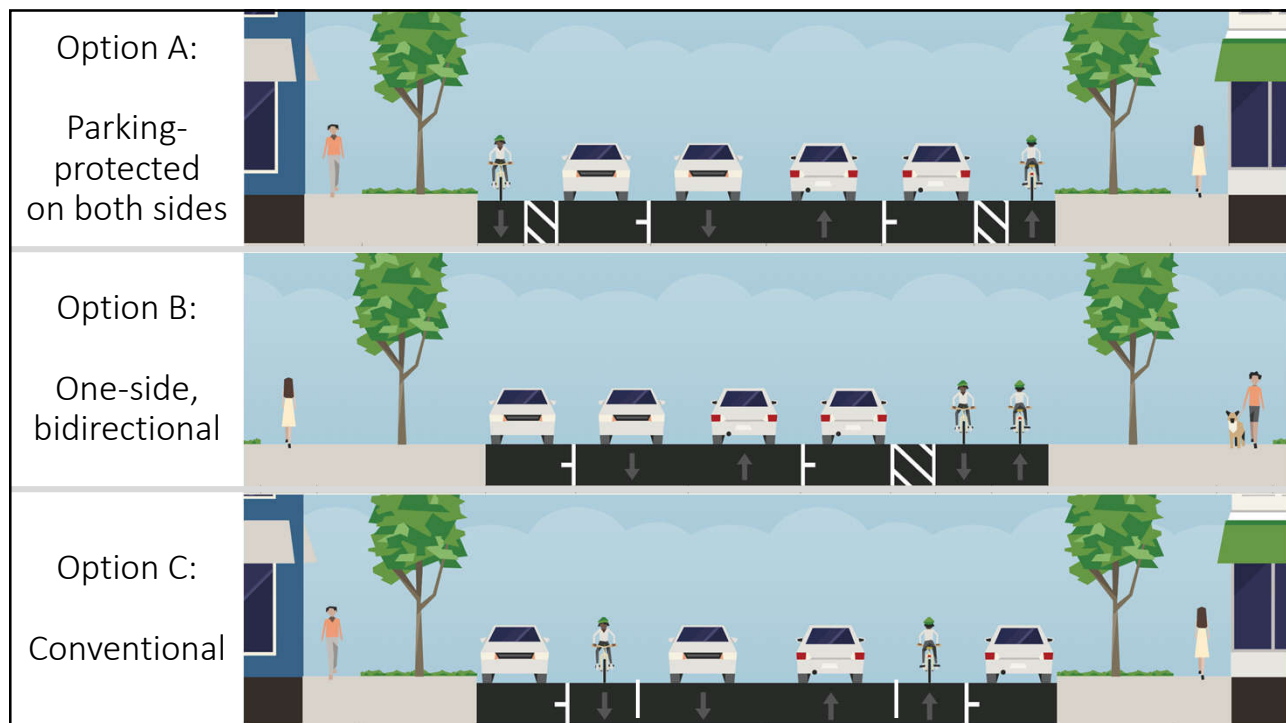
