Ruth Kendall provided an updated from recent Council meetings and the current direction for this board

24-00432 COLD WEATHER SHELTER

Dian Cooper spoke on the history of the cold weather shelter. There are a few rules, but it is low barrier. There were no deaths over the winter due to cold weather. Kayce Settlemier shared personal examples of how positive outcomes can come from the cold weather shelters staff exposure that leads to individuals getting into services. There is currently about \$75,000 carry over to continue on. Costs to do nothing - hotel vouchers, deaths, EMS services, medical costs (frozen toes, etc.), break ins, and police

calls. Kayce painted a picture of what could be and how we can do this better including collaboration from all agencies. The first hurdle is finding a site. The MAC was heavily discussed and the option of trying to moving events from the MAC to the Women's Club or Delaware Plaza. Creating a list of options for locations was discussed.
